Topics include: main approaches in the science of personality; units for conceptualizing persons; the role of dispositions; evolutionary bases of individual differences; concept of the self; the meaning of normality, abnormality, and deviance; consistency in behavior; development and maintenance of personality problems; defense, coping and regulatory processes; emotion and motivation; personality and physical health; personality and ideological orientation.
