The course focuses on the current research on gender roles in psychology. 3.	Theories of gender. Psychobiology, evolutionary psychology, sociobiology, psychoanalytic theory, social learning theory, gender roles socialization, social role theory, cognitive development theory, gender schema theory, context theories.	2
4.	Gender roles and gender development throughout the life-span. Childhood and adolescence. The role of cognitive and social factors. Gender identity. Gender and body image. Gender, adult development and aging.	2
5.	Gender-role attitudes. Affective, cognitive and behavioral components. Descriptive and prescriptive gender stereotypes. The effects of gender stereotypes on judgments and decisions.	2
6.	Psychological study of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender issues. Terminology, definitions and history. Sexual orientation, identity and diversity: from categories to complexity. Prejudices and heterosexism. LGBT development and special issues.	2
7.	Sex-related comparisons in different domains. Cognitive abilities, personality functioning, moral development, social behavior, achievement, education, communication, friendship, romantic relationships, work, eating behavior, physical and mental health.	2
8.	Gender and society. Sexism and discrimination. Sexual harassment. Gender violence. Fear, shame, silence and gender identity. Gendered societies: ideologies, status, power and inequalities. Gender and media.	2
