Summary

Organization of Ph.D. studies, preparing a dissertation and scientific writing for psychology journals course offers an introduction into the nature of the doctoral level studies and the way to organize activities and time for successful completion of the goals. It provides practical guidance into writing a plan of the PhD studies, instruction on the nature and scope of the tasks, time schedule, selection and execution of activities in order to prepare and defend a dissertation. The second part is reserved for learning the art of scientific writing. It is focused on the particular requirements for publications in international peer-reviewed psychological journals. The course attendants are expected to write an article on the subject of their dissertation and to submit it for analysis and feedback from the lecturer and the peers. The course closes with practical advice for participation in international conferences and presentation by the course attendants of a paper for a scientific conference.
